YOUTH INTERNSHIP PROGRAM



The AHMA youth employment initiative provides work experience and on-the-job training for Indigenous youth. The goal of the program is to assist youth in gaining work experience and pursuing long-term employment in the housing sector, or a related field.

What it's all about

Our internships can provide youth with much-needed work experience and on-the-job training. Internship opportunities can include positions in:

- housing administration
- maintenance
- construction
- tenant relations
- and more

Big opportunities

AHMA is committed to helping Indigenous youth prepare for long-term employment in the housing industry

Housing is more than four walls. It's building homes. In the same way, the AHMA internship program is more than filling seats. It's about creating space for Indigenous youth to learn and then lead.

Resources available to our interns include:

- On-the-job training
- Coaching and mentoring
- Support for relevant training & skills development
- Opportunities for interns to strengthen their skills in communication, teamwork, and problem-solving

This program allows Indigenous organizations to recruit and connect talented young professionals with unique opportunities. Only Indigenous youth are eligible to apply.

Details

- The internship is open to all Indigenous youth between the ages of 15 and 30
- Must not be otherwise employed during the internship.
- Must not be receiving Employment Insurance benefits or must agree to discontinue the benefits before starting the internship.

Individuals must be available for a minimum of 8 weeks*



The AHMA internship program promises to provide a high level of professional development and training that will prepare university and/or college graduates for more senior roles in the housing sector and beyond.
