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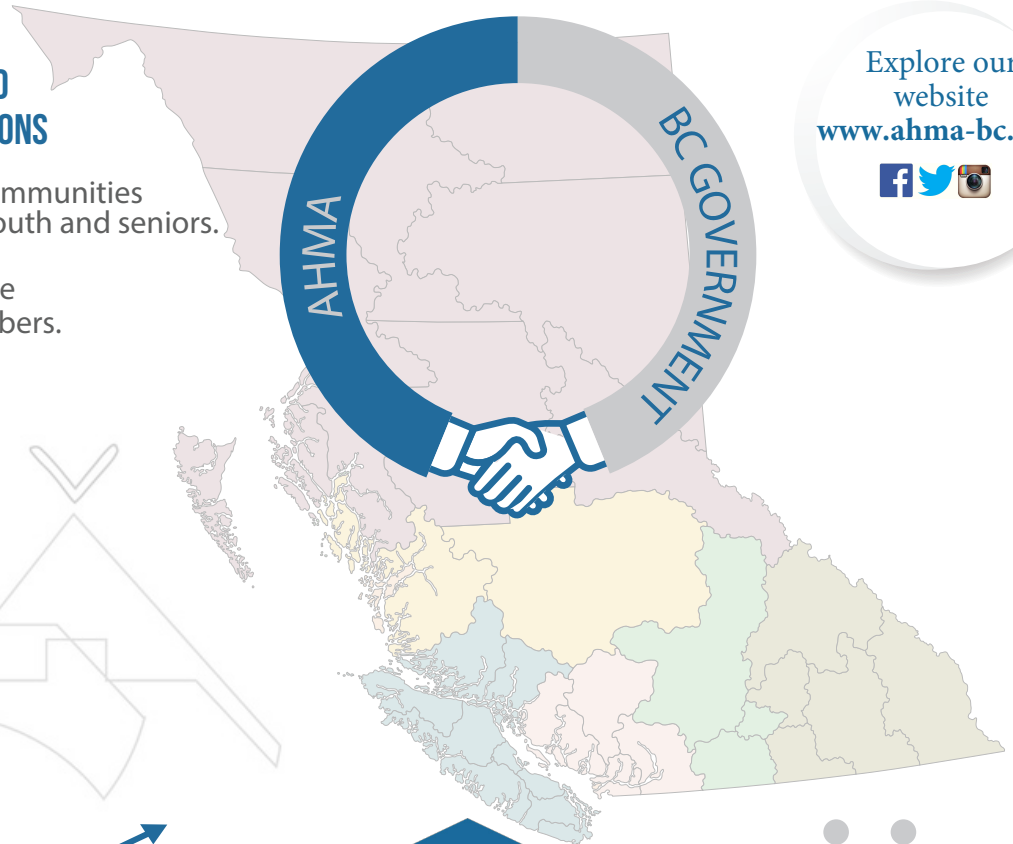

AHMA is committed to supporting the entire range along the housing continuum. From emergency shelters to home ownership.

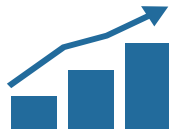

Indigenous Innovation:
AHMA & partners built the first affordable housing Passive House in Nanaimo BC.

Tenant energy bills will not exceed **\$20** a month in the one to three bedroom townhouses.



AHMA oversees 4200 housing units + an additional **1000** upcoming.
AHMA has successfully managed **\$175 million** of public funds in the last 5 years.

BC Housing signs interim self management agreement – authorizing AHMA to subsidize Aboriginal Housing Providers.



AHMA has 41 corporate members from across BC.

Governed by an Independent Board and Good Governance Committee.

AHMA & BC Housing issue Building BC: Indigenous Fund - \$550 Million over the next 10 years for urban, rural and northern Indigenous housing.



1 in 15 Indigenous People in Urban centers are homeless.

Indigenous children make up over **50%** of all youth in foster care in Canada.

Over **87%** of all Indigenous Peoples are living off reserve in Canada .

Future Forward

Informal collective of Aboriginal housing society forms, called the Urban Native Housing Societies of BC (UNSHC) UNSHC eventually evolves into what is now AHMA.

AHMA and BC Housing sign BC Aboriginal Social Housing Management Agreement (ASHMA) – devolving all housing programs to AHMA.

AHMA strengthens self-governance. Moves to 8 Independent Directors including one appointee from BC Housing.
